

Year in Review

The WIDA Consortium Report is prepared annually to provide a concise review of the previous year's activities. This report covers the time period of July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024.

The 2023–2024 year marked WIDA's 20th anniversary, a milestone celebrated through a series of reflective articles that highlighted the organization's core values, origins, and growth over two decades. The anniversary festivities culminated at the WIDA Annual Conference, where educators and WIDA staff gathered for professional development and a special 20th anniversary reception.

WIDA remained dedicated to its mission of advancing academic language development and academic achievement for multilingual learners as their population continued to grow nationwide. By developing innovative resources, fostering professional development, and collaborating with our trusted partners of member states, territories, and federal agencies, WIDA strengthened its commitment to serving multilingual learners, their educators, and their families, ensuring they have the tools they need to thrive.

Highlights

The 2023–2024 year saw the launch of new projects, a record number of educators attending the WIDA Annual Conference, and new professional learning opportunities and resources for educators. Here are some highlights:

- WIDA celebrated the 10th anniversary of the WIDA Annual Conference. It was a hybrid event with more than 1,300 people attending in-person in Milwaukee, WI, with 1,300 people joining live virtually and 450 recording-only attendees.
- Marco de los estándares del desarrollo auténtico del lenguaje español de WIDA (Marco DALE), WIDA's Spanish language development standards framework, launched in October. Gradelevel clusters, reference cards, and new bundles launched in May. There were more than 1,700 downloads of the Marco DALE book.
- Two new self-paced workshops were developed for the Marco DALE.
- The revised WIDA Alternate ACCESS had its first operational administration.
- WIDA Webinars, a new, free learning opportunity, launched. Five webinars offered educators insights and resources on a variety of topics relevant to educators of multilingual learners.
- WIDA staff welcomed SEAs during the Annual Board Meeting in June, for subcommittee events in October, and for the Executive Committee meeting in December.
- A new article series exploring WIDA assessments and the processes behind them, including explainers on the creation of assessments, field testing, cognitive labs, and scoring, launched with more planned for the future.

Assessment News

During the 2023–2024 assessment year, over 2,800,000 students took WIDA assessments. Here are some key milestones:

- The Revising ACCESS project team developed a new Writing Scoring Rubric grounded in the WIDA English Language Development Standards Framework, 2020 Edition. This new rubric will be used for scoring responses to the writing tasks on WIDA ACCESS Online and WIDA ACCESS Paper in 2025–2026, and the future revised WIDA Screener Online and WIDA Screener Paper.
- The Redesigning Kindergarten ACCESS project held two test development events before gearing up for field testing. In October 2023, WIDA and CAL conducted cognitive labs at five schools around the WIDA Consortium. In February and March 2024, more than 50 educators from 17 states participated in Kindergarten ACCESS pilot testing.
- The WIDA Assessment Content Team and the Center for Applied Linguistics (CAL) Test
 Development Team continued to develop new items that are aligned to the WIDA ELD Standards
 Framework for the revised WIDA ACCESS Online and Paper tests being released in 2025–2026.
 This content was field tested in 2023–2024 in Florida on ACCESS for ELLs Online and WIDA
 ACCESS for ELLs Paper. Additional field testing will take place in 2024–2025 as well.
- A project team formed to begin planning for the work to align WIDA Screener Online and WIDA Screener Paper to the WIDA ELD Standards Framework for the 2028–2029 administration year.
- The WIDA Alternate Proficiency Level Descriptors and brand-new Alternate ACCESS sample test items were published.
- WIDA completed the recruitment window for the Alternate ACCESS Standard Setting Study event, working with SEAs who encouraged educators to apply.

Research News

WIDA conducts research that advances multilingual learner education. Here are some highlights of this year:

- WIDA published five Focus Bulletins, making research accessible to educators.
- The first cohort of Project RESPECT started, made up of 59 participants from four Wisconsin school districts. Project RESPECT is a 5-year National Professional Development (NPD) grant to provide a PD program for rural teachers serving multilingual learners.
- The Yugtun Piciryaranek Qaneryaranek-llu Cuqyun (Yup'ik Culture and Language Measurement) K–6 assessment was administered across the Lower Kuskokwim School District in Alaska, and reports were provided to stakeholders.
- WIDA researchers Narek Sahakyan and Glenn Poole explored trends in English learner proficiency since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- WIDA researcher Lynn Shafer Willner was awarded the 2024 NJTESOL/NJBE President's Award, which recognizes work that significantly advanced the needs of multilingual learners in New Jersey.
- Several studies by WIDA researchers were published as book chapters in peer-reviewed journals.
