What it was you were proud of and share it with your partner. [Students Talking]

Okay. So the first thing that I always think when I look at a lesson or I see what the grade level content is, is what does the MLL student need to know to access this information? What do they need to know to participate in the class activities? And then along with that, I think about like what background do they have that I could pull into it?

Now remembering that thing that you said that you were proud of, the next thing I want you to talk about is how do you think that made the people around you feel? So like if Sayed was really proud of the goal that he made in soccer, I want you to think about maybe how do you think that made your team feel? How did that make the people watching you play the game feel? Okay? Do you understand the question? Thumbs up or down? Do you think that when you, so can, Ceeja, can I use your example? So Ceeja said that she was proud of her brother 'cause he was able to do his math, right?

But Ceeja helped him with his math, right? And then she said that her parents were proud because she helped her brother with her math. Do you think that that like brought their family together or kind of like pulled their family apart together? Together. Together? Right. So when we've been talking about landing on the moon, this was a really big thing. And remember we said the word mankind. So all humans, right? Yeah. So all people kind of came together 'cause they were really excited about it. Okay, so we're gonna read a little part from the book.

So for example, we're talking a lot about space and so although the experience of watching the moon landing on TV might not be something that they've experienced or their parents talking about it, but they have experienced doing something together that united them together. So what we did this morning in our lesson is to kind of bring in like what are some responsibilities that you have at home and how do your parents feel about that or your family and how does that unite you as a family when you all do something that you're proud of. So like to compare that to the moon landing, like this was something that a lot of people put a lot of effort into and a lot of people were proud of. So then it's kind of like evoke some of that emotion, helps them connect better to the material that we're talking about.
